Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

It is with great pleasure that we present to you the 2004 Berea Municipal Court Annual Report. Again, because of prudent business practices we are pleased to announce that the Berea Municipal Court operated under budget and finished the year with revenue exceeding expenses.

Highlights

During 2004, the Berea Municipal Court initiated a number of new programs to help ensure the financial integrity of the Berea Municipal Court as well as streamline our operations in the interest of public service.

A deputy clerk is now assigned to the courtroom when the Judge is on the bench when administering his docket. The clerk enters all of the relevant information into our computer system at the time of the hearing. The defendant then presents himself/herself to the traffic/criminal counter where paperwork completed in the courtroom can be processed quickly and efficiently. This procedure has dramatically cut the cost of time for defendants, as well as the staff, in the Clerks Office.

Beginning in 2004 the Berea Municipal Court made great strides electronically in communicating with the Bureau of Motor Vehicles. The Berea Municipal Court no longer sends, via the mail, reports on all defendants that are required by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles. Those reports are now sent electronically saving the Berea Municipal Court paper, postage and labor costs.

During the calendar year 2004, the Berea Municipal Court relocated for a day to Berea and Midpark High Schools, where the Judge conducted his docket in front of the junior and senior classes of each school. During these presentations the students had a chance to observe video arraignment of prisoners and actual cases involving defendants charged with DUI's, speeding and petty thefts. This was a very rewarding experience for the students and we will be continuing the program in 2005 at other high schools throughout our district.

We are pleased to announce that floor plans for our new court facility are complete and look forward to groundbreaking this year. Construction time will be approximately fifteen (15) months with the Court moving into this facility in late 2006 in order to meet our growing needs. This project is possible, in part, because of the Mayors Courts within our district. It is believed that this will be the first Municipal Court built in the State of Ohio without the use of taxpayers funds. It is the intent of the Court to fully fund this project out of funds collected on cases adjudicated by the Courts. The Court continues to fund the Berea Municipal Court Construction Fund with approximately \$100,000.00 being collected in 2004. This fund will continue to help fund our capital expansion for our new court facility.

A heartfelt thank you to the entire staff including our Acting Judges, Magistrates, staff of the Traffic/Criminal Division, Civil Division, Probation and Bailiffs, for the wonderful job they completed in 2004. Our staff of Deputy Clerks are truly professionals and complete their work in an efficient and business-like manner, and are ever mindful of the people we serve.

In closing, thank you to Mayor Joseph W. Biddlecombe, his directors, staff and Berea City Council, Police Chief Harry Bernhardt and his officers for their support. We appreciate your kindness, the confidence you have in us and your cooperation with us in the efficient administration of the Berea Municipal Court.

In conclusion, you can rest assured that we will continue to monitor and evaluate the operations and expenses of this court and can assure you that the Berea Municipal Court will be administered in a fiscally responsible and business-like manner.



2004 PROBATION DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Probation Department has a staff of 5 serving at the pleasure of the Judge. The Probation Officers supervised, as directed by the court, approximately 2,320 defendants/probationers during 2004. In addition, the Probation Department monitored at least, 1,855 probationers attending various Alcoholics Anonymous meetings.

At the direction of the Chief Probation Officer, the Short Term Alcohol Program (STAP) was introduced to the Probation Department. The defendants participate in a group setting once a week for four weeks. The syllabus for this program consists of four sessions; 1) Introduction 2) Body and the Brain 3) Family and Relationships 4) Personality Defects and Coping Mechanism. Since its inception in September of 2004, thirty one defendants successfully completed the program.

The DUS Diversion Program continued to succeed this year, by helping approximately 335 defendants reinstate their driver's license. The First Offenders Program has also continued succeeding this year by giving approximately 109 defendants the opportunity to amend their behavior and avoid having a conviction record and prevent recidivism.

The Chief Probation Officer speaks at the 72 hour Drunk Driving Program once a month and during the aftercare program of the outpatient alcohol program. She also conducts a discussion group for probationers charged with public indecency, which involved 17 defendants in the year of 2004.
